



Peel Regional Police Responds to Extortion Surge

In light of an unsettling surge in extortion attempts, Peel Regional Police has initiated a specialized task force to address the alarming trend. Predominantly targeting members of the South Asian business community, these extortion efforts unfold through various social media platforms, where threats of violence are coupled with demands for money. In some instances, these threats have escalated into acts of violence, prompting ongoing investigations into nine incidents.

On December 9, 2023, Peel Investigative Task Force (EITF), a Regional Police took swift action by apprehending Tanmanjot Gill, a 23-year-old individual from Abbotsford, British Columbia. Gill faces charges related to discharging a firearm and firing multiple rounds at a business near Rutherford Road South and Clark Boulevard in Brampton. The search continues for a second suspect, described as a South Asian male of medium build, initially seen in a grey sweatshirt and later changing into a black sweatshirt adorned with a white X on the back. Residents are urged to report any sightings to 9-1-1, refraining from approaching the suspect due to potential armed status.

In response to these concern-
